After graduating from two masters (Marketing and Strategic Innovation Management) in February 2014, I started an internship in a consulting company that supports product placement based on category management. I hoped that this internship would be my "foot in the door", but I realized that this wasn't the kind of job I wanted. With the end of the internship, the summer break started. This complicated my job search, as so many recruiters are out of office. I used a staffing firm to increase my chances, but apparently summer isn't the best time to look for a job. So I learned my first lesson: start early, write a lot of applications, and give your plans a bit of time.

In November 2014 I found a job, starting as a trainee for <u>Deutsche See GmbH</u>. We sell fish (fresh, frozen, smoked or prepared) for retail, food service and gastronomy. We have two sub-brands: BEECK Feinkost (delicatessen salads, antipasti and dips) and CityFarming (convenience food like, wraps, sandwiches and salads "to go").

I started my traineeship at the finance department. Six weeks later, I moved on to the non-food purchase department as they were in need of support. I worked there for four months and was surprised to see how much fun I had in analyzing our storage, finding cost-saving possibilities and negotiating with suppliers. In the next two months, I worked on a couple smaller projects for the controlling department. My next station within my traineeship was performed in three out of our 21 subsidiaries. I not only joined the salesforce, but also delivered our products to our customers and developed a lot respect for our truck drivers. In September I was asked to join the marketing team to work for the BEECK brand. I finalized some of the current projects, and launched our new "self-service" assortment with my first flyer. I enjoy the work and working atmosphere at Deutsche See. I feel that I can add sufficient value,

hours – forth and back. I am very grateful for the different perspectives I was able to gather during my traineeship. The multiple perspectives have helped me to better understand the needs of the different departments in each project. In 2012, after having completed my Bachelor's degree in International Business Management, I signed up for the master program Strategic Innovation Management. So I moved to Hamburg and started an internship at Sturm und Drang GmbH, an agency focused on cultural research and open innovation.
